

Vocalization

Growl or roar as a warning

Hissing or snorting signifies aggression.

Mama bear scolds her cubs with a low growl.

Body Language

They wag their heads side to side when they want to play.

Lowered head signifies aggression.

Attacking bears charge with heads down and ears laid back.

Mama bear uses her body, muzzle or paws to comfort, protect or scold her cubs.
